Charities You Are Supporting

- People want to know where their gifts are going.
- List the charities and link to their websites.
- Use present parish ministries to identify those in need. For example: food pantry clients, those in need identified by parish staff or town welfare departments.
- Be specific: our gifts will help by... (providing toys for this charity, helping support this shelter, distributing gifts to this nursing home).

What Kind of Support Are You Asking For ?

- Gift Donation - Tag off the physical tree.
- Monetary Donation - Either online or in person. How is that being done ?
- Gift cards - Put back on tree or drop them off ?
- Volunteers - What is specifically needed ? Family friendly ? Give different opportunities.

Calendar

- Start advertising early - do not assume everyone knows the history.
- When do you start and when do you finish ? When do gifts and donations need to be in ?
- When can you start advertising ?
- How do you celebrate the success of the Giving Tree with the parish ?
